According to Dr. Ian Jones of Cardiff University, the intersection of bipolar disorder and pregnancy can lead to the "most severe episodes of illness in psychiatric practice." My first thought upon hearing this was: How is this not already a movie? Why is no one talking about this? So I decided to tackle it.

I am interested in stories about the female experience and also think at length about my responsibility to create work that does not perpetuate stigmas or marginalize. Yet at the same time, I want to tell compelling stories—ones in which characters sometimes have to behave in ways that create conflict. It was straddling that fine line between art and commerce, social responsibility and engaging storytelling, truth in representation and imagination that *Maggie Black* was created.

Not only did I research the topic thoroughly, but I also deal with my own chronic depression and anxiety issues. So I tried to draw on both for Maggie. I wanted to make her as close to a "real person" as possible. To portray someone who makes a series of well-intentioned, but ultimately bad choices that force her down a disastrous path. She is not inept, dangerous, childlike, or possessed. Nor does she perpetuate the sweeping generalizations about people diagnosed with a psychiatric disorder. We see the world from her perspective, fall into the traps that she does, understand her anger with her husband, and, like Maggie, we don't realize how bad it's gotten until it's too late. While Maggie is certainly not a poster child for being bipolar and pregnant I hope that we've given voice to this particular struggle by telling her story.

When the Chief of Service at John's Hopkins Medical saw Maggie Black she said "every doctor in the country should see this film." She appreciated its medical accuracy, but more importantly the insight it gave into the life of someone living with a mental illness. It is not a film about a disease but about a family and how they deal with the relationship mental illness forms in their unit. Maggie and Tom's marriage consists of the relationship between themselves as a couple, between Maggie and her illness, and between Tom and Maggie's illness. When Maggie lies about staying on her meds to avoid conflict she sees as inevitable due to Tom's biased fears about her judgment it reverberates throughout their marriage. The lie spreads and the consequences compound as Tom ignores warning signs and engages in his own self-deception.

This web of interconnectedness heightened by lies and hiding is a reflection of the current mental health situation in America. People living with mental illnesses often do not seek help when they need it for fear of losing credibility and freedom: One in five Americans experiences a mental health condition every year but only half receive treatment. Tom's desire to ignore the problem mirrors society's current inertia. People living with mental illness have seen vastly increased rates of homelessness, interactions with police leading to deadly force, and incarceration over the last thirty years. Yet efforts to alleviate these problems are not coming quickly enough, if at all. Instead depression, anxiety, drug abuse, and suicide are on the rise.

Medical professionals and people who have firsthand experience with mental illness have proved to be the films most passionate supporters. But we've also heard viewers without direct exposure to mental conditions talk about how the film helped them to empathize with people living with mental illness and invited them to ask tough questions about what society's role in this arena ought to be.


I believe that people living with mental illness deserve to get the treatment they need when they need it and to live in a society where they are accepted as they are without shame and my hope is that *Maggie Black* will contribute positively towards building that future.
